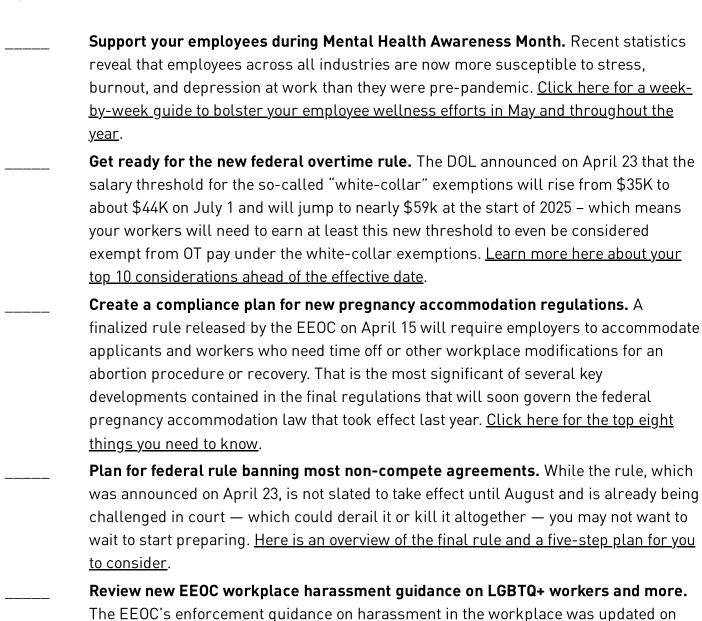


## Workplace Law Update: 12 Essential Items on Your May To-Do List
