






Coronavirus: How does it compare to other diseases?

Employee Issues



Presidential Proclamation

President Trump issued a Presidential Proclamation limiting the entry of most foreign nationals who were physically present in China during the 14-day period before their attempted entry into the United States. This travel restriction took effect on February 2.

Currently it only impacts those who were physically in Mainland China and Iran (added March 4th). It does not yet include Hong Kong, Macau, or Taiwan.





Government Coordination

White House Proclamations Precede Agency Coordination

- Department of State: Visa Issuance at Embassies and Consulates
 - Emergency procedures can be announced an any time that can delay.
- Customs and Border Patrol: Admissions at Ports of Entry
 - February 2, 2020 All flights from China are restricted to 11 U.S. Airports
- USCIS Offices: Adjudications of Immigration Benefits
 - Field offices in Beijing and Guangzhou closed on February 5th
 - Seattle Field office closed on March 3rd for two weeks



Specific Visa impact

- Student visas on F and M status may go thought additional screening
- Processing times for visa applications relatively unchanged for now
- Not all foreign nationals are subject to the restriction. Exempt status includes Lawful Permanent Residents, spouses and children (unmarried under 21) of U.S. citizens and LPRs, parents and siblings of unmarried under 21-year-old U.S. citizens and LPRs.
- People traveling on crew member visas, or diplomatic or International Organization visas.
- In order to avoid entry denial, a non-exempt foreign national will have to travel to a third country, remain there for at least 14 days before coming to the U.S.
