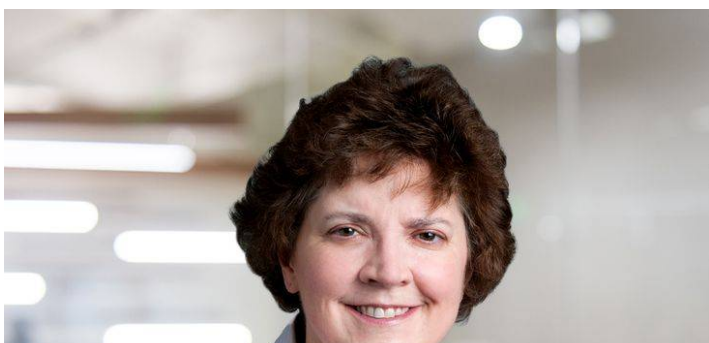
Jessica Cook discussed the continued issuance of Form I-9 Notices of Inspection to businesses across the nation by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement.
