

New H-1B Rule Change Likely to Save Time and Costs for Employers, Says Atlanta Partner

The federal government published its final rule amending the regulations that will govern petitions filed under the H-1B work visa lottery. But what impact will this rule change have on employers? In an interview with *TechTarget*, Atlanta partner Shanon Stevenson explained that the new process is "going to save employers time and money because they're not going to have to submit an H-1B petition for someone who isn't selected in the lottery." The new registration system, which will begin in the 2021 fiscal year, means an employer will be able to register a visa candidate in a visa lottery "without submitting a completed [visa] package," she added.
