

Inc. Interviews Lawyer on How Employers Should – and Should Not – Handle Post-Pandemic Opening

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In an interview with *Inc.*, **Travis Vance** explains that employers must handle post-pandemic opening plans carefully to avoid legal claims related to COVID-19. He provided guidance on how employers can preemptively reduce the risk in their facilities and offered these five things employers should *NOT* do when creating and implementing reopening plans.

- 1. Don't automatically adopt a company-run temperature-taking operation.
- 2. Don't assume social distancing will be easy to enforce.
- 3. Don't assume all of your workers will feel safe enough to come back to work.
- 4. Don't equip your team with masks without a proper procedure in place.
- 5. Don't forget to come up with a plan for how to handle visitors to your office.

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
