



Workplace Safety Co-Chair Discusses How OSHA Might Encourage Employers to Offer Inoculations to Workers

In an interview with *Bloomberg Law*, partner **Travis Vance** discusses how the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) might encourage employers to offer inoculations to workers when a COVID-19 vaccine becomes widely available. Travis explains that OSHA will not be able to *mandate* that employers provide vaccinations, but the agency could “...in theory use the general duty clause of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 to cite any employer who didn’t offer COVID-19 vaccines.”
