2015 brought more changes to the OSHA enforcement landscape than we've seen in the last 30 years.

A judge's ruling in December that Fed-OSHA could seek abatement of alleged hazards at every location operated by an employer, even if OSHA had never inspected those sites, surprised us all. <u>See our previous article on Sec. of Labor v. Central Transport, LLC</u>. The *Central Transport, LLC* ruling is part of what appears to be Fed-OSHA's attempt to expand its enforcement reach even though its resources are limited. Given a tighter budget, the agency wants to remain effective while completing fewer inspections.
