BOSTON PARTNER DISCUSSES BIDEN NLRB'S REVIEW OF BOEING WORK RULE TEST

In a Law360 article detailing the recent move by the National Labor and Relations Board (NLRB) to review a Trump-era decision that makes it easier for employers to defend handbook policies against claims they stifle worker rights, **Joshua Nadreau** said that he expects them to return to the Lutheran Heritage Standard — a “standard so broad that it almost moots the analysis,” he said.

“Coming from that sort of focus, it’s really hard to write a rule where there’s no conceivable way to interpret it in a way that wouldn’t chill an employee’s Section 7 rights,” he added.

The 2017 decision up for review overturned a 2004 ruling that said policies violate the National Labor Relations Act when they could be “reasonably construed” as restricting union organizing and other activity protected by the law.
