### ***Overview***

#### **Recent Examples of Cases Handled:**

- Represented a large national provider of emergency care services in defeating a union by a large margin after the union signed up more than three-quarters of the employees. This matter proceeded very quickly under the NLRB’s new procedures.
- Successfully represented an electric cooperative in an arbitration with a long term employee who caused serious damage to a bucket truck.
- Successfully represented a distribution employer in an arbitration regarding their driver who got into an altercation on a customer’s loading dock.
- Served as the lead negotiator in collective bargaining negotiations which resulted in more than a million dollars of savings for a national distribution client.
