The 2023 Washington legislative session has been a blockbuster. Shortly, Governor Inslee is expected to sign a number of important employment and privacy bills that will have immediate and long-term repercussions for both Washington employers and out-of-state companies doing business in Washington. New legislation to be covered:

- HB 1106 – Allowing employees who quit to care for vulnerable individuals to collect unemployment benefits
- HB 1068 – Empowering injured workers to record compelled medical examinations
- SB 5454 – Providing workers' compensation benefits to nurses experiencing PTSD
- SB 5286 – Changing the formula for calculating Washington Paid Family and Medical Leave benefits
- SB 5123 – Prohibiting employment discipline based on off-duty cannabis use
- SB 5111 – Requiring payment of unused sick leave for non-residential construction workers
- HB 1187 – Making union conversations with their members privileged
- SB 5217 – Allowing the State to pass workplace regulations for ergonomic injuries
- HB 1555 – Implementing the broadest health data privacy protections in the nation
- And more
