AB 1825 Supervisor Anti-Harassment Training

AB 1825 requires that all California employers with five or more employees provide at least two hours of anti-harassment training to all supervisory employees. Fisher Phillips' anti-harassment training workshop is a cost-effective way to provide this mandatory training to supervisors. SB 1343 Employee Train-the-Trainer

The passage of SB 1343 expands the AB 1825 training requirement to now require all employers with five or more employees to provide anti-harassment training for nonsupervisory employees. It requires all nonsupervisory employees to complete one hour of anti-harassment training. All employees must be trained within six months of being hired and every two years thereafter.

This session, exclusively for qualified human resources professionals, will equip them with the knowledge, confidence, and materials to conduct SB 1343 training in their workplace.
