

Kentucky OSHA to Consider Lowering Fall Protection Trigger Height

The Kentucky Occupational Safety and Health Standards Board will consider amending the state's rule, <u>803 KAR 2:412</u>, at its annual meeting on May 10 at the Galt House Hotel in Louisville, according to the session's <u>agenda</u>. Currently, Kentucky requires fall protection for residential construction at 10 feet, but is considering changing the trigger height to six (6) feet to adopt the Federal OSHA requirement.
