

Five Tips To Keep A Lawsuit From Crashing Your Holiday Party

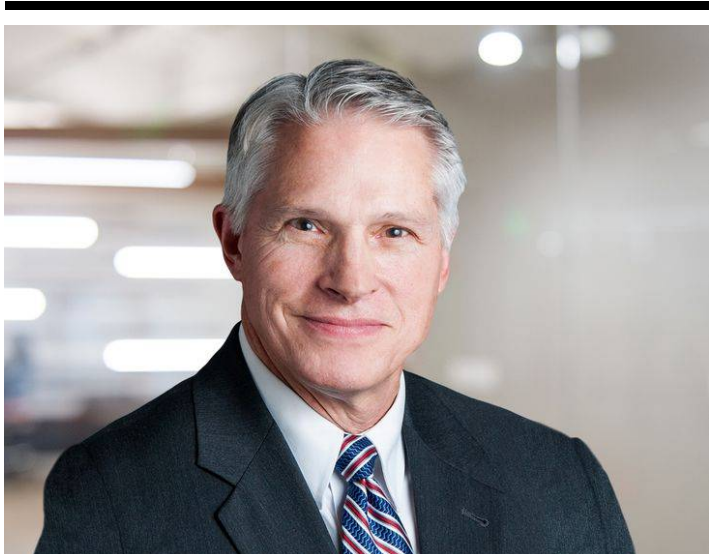

These managers should be briefed before the festivities about dealing with bad behavior immediately and steering workers away from harassment or exchanges that look like they are becoming too heated. “Even if a manager is not a designee to police [the party], he or she has got to know that they are setting the example. Employees will do what they do, so they need to conduct themselves as managers and supervisors and they need to be reserved.”

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
